

WELCOME TO OUR HIGH ROPES COURSE

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For your own safety and enjoyment, we would like to remind you that climbing from tree to tree, several meters above the ground, in complete autonomy, is a high-risk activity which requires strict compliance with a number of obligations and recommendations.

- 1/ Be in good physical condition, with no osteoporosis or heart problems, and have not taken any substances that might alter your behavior (alcohol, drugs, medication, etc.). Also be in good moral form and not prone to vertigo.
- 2/ Follow the briefing and introductory course provided, and comply strictly with the safety instructions given to you, first and foremost the double belay.
- 3/ Always wear protective equipment. Dress appropriately for the activity, in particular with suitable footwear (see "Safety instructions" for more details).
- 4/ Seek advice or assistance from our operators if you have any questions or problems.

By taking part in this high-risk activity, you agree to :

- Close the course in the event of bad weather.
- Exclude any person whose behavior presents a risk to others and/or to themselves.
- Refuse access to the courses to any person whom we deem not to meet the necessary physical and moral requirements, or who is inappropriately dressed.

By paying your admission fee, you expressly acknowledge that you have read these terms and conditions and accept them in their entirety.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY

The proposed activity is a self-guided activity which requires compliance with a number of safety instructions.

1. The activity is autonomous, without continuous supervision of the participant, and takes place in an aseptic environment, easily accessible by vehicle, with immediate means of communication with emergency services.
2. Modules made available, but subject to restrictions on use and safety operating rules.
3. Preliminary instructions, including training in basic self-belay techniques.
4. Supervision of activity.
5. 4-level intervention: Reminder of instructions / Help for a person in difficulty / Evacuation / 1st aid intervention.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Riders agree to comply fully with the safety instructions set out below during the introductory briefing and by the supervisors throughout the activity and for the duration of their stay on the site.

- Initiation is compulsory, even for those with previous experience in other parks.
- Double safety line compulsory throughout the course and on all modules.
- Careful with long hair (to be tied back) and any other accessory that could get caught (scarf, jewellery, hood, etc.) or objects that could fall out while climbing (glasses, keys, wallet, etc.).
- No parking or driving under the activities or platforms.
- No smoking.

LIMITS AND RESTRICTIONS OF USE

- Access to the course is limited to opening hours and reserved for park customers who have paid an entrance fee. Access to the course is strictly forbidden outside these opening hours.
- Unaccompanied minors (parents, guardians, etc.) are not allowed on the course.
- Access to the course is reserved for people who have not experienced any difficulty on the beginners' course.
- Access to the course is reserved for people over 1.40 m tall and weighing less than 110 kg.
- No more than 3 people may be parked on any one platform, with the exception of the zip lines.

- Only 1 person at a time may be present on the zip lines: it is imperative to wait until the previous person has removed his or her equipment from the cable before embarking on the zip line.

The operators reserve the right to exclude - without compensation or reimbursement - any person present on the premises who fails to comply with the above instructions or restrictions.

INSURANCE AND PERSONAL LIABILITY

- Anyone present on the course is deemed to have taken out third-party liability and personal accident insurance.

- Minors are under the responsibility of their parents or guardians, who undertake to supervise them throughout the course, whether or not they accompany the minor on the course.

STAFF IDENTIFICATION AND QUALIFICATION

Acro'Park staff are identifiable by their clothing and, where applicable, by the fact that they carry a first-aid bag.

They hold a certificate of professional qualification issued by an approved body (CQP OPAH).

The professional qualification of Acrobatic Course Operator gives him/her the following duties:

- Provide information on the proper use of equipment and workshops for participants

- Check that participants are properly equipped

- Evaluate ability to perform independently on a test course at height

- Ensure compliance with safety instructions

- Alert the operator at height if necessary.

The list of personnel is posted at the park reception desk.
